Backup options:

It's preferable to have a reliable backup solution if possible in case your main connection goes down, ensuring minimal disruption to online learning or work. A USP (Uninterrupted Power Supply) is also a good idea. A UPS is a device that provides backup power during outages, protects against power surges, and gives you enough time to save your work, prevent data loss, and safely shut down your devices without interruption.

Updated plans:



Retail Service Providers (RSPs) frequently adjust their plans. Check for new data limits, speed options, or pricing updates. A new plan might suit your household's current needs better. There might even be new providers servicing your area.

Changing household needs:

Household demands may increase or decrease over time. More devices, heavier workloads, or school holidays might require higher data limits or faster speeds.

Improved equipment:

New technology, such as Wi-Fi extenders or updated routers, can significantly enhance connectivity and reliability. Upgrading your setup could make online classes and video calls seamless.

Cost-saving resources:

Look into programs like the School Student Broadband Initiative (SSBI) or free Microsoft Office subscriptions to support your students and your budget. There is also a free Canva subscription for students and teachers.
